Did You Know?

Keep your mind hopping with these fun facts.

- South Australia accounts for almost 80% of Australia's premium wine production, made from some of the oldest vines in the world.
- Aerospace engineer, Andy Thomas, was born in Adelaide, making him the first Australian NASA astronaut in space.
- Adelaide Fringe Festival is the second largest Fringe festival worldwide.
- Kangaroo Island is seven times larger than Singapore.
- The distance from Adelaide CBD to the Adelaide Airport is only 2 lengths of the Adelaide runway.
- The Adelaide Central Market is the largest undercover fresh produce market in the Southern Hemisphere.
- Secluded from mainland Australia for over 10,000 years, Kangaroo Island is the only place in the world still able to produce pure Ligurian Honey.
- The 600-million year old Ikara Flinders Ranges National Park has been home to Aboriginal tribe, the Adnyamathanha people, for tens of thousands of years.
- The highest temperature recorded in Australia was in 1960 at Oodnadatta where it reached 50.7°C (123.3°F) – now that is hot!
- Anna Creek Station is the world's largest working cattle station; at 6-million acres in size, it is larger than the country of Israel.
- Red Kangaroos can grow up to 2-metres tall, reach speeds of up to 65 kilometres (40 miles) per hour and they can jump 3 metres (10 feet) high!
- Australia's largest in-land lake, Kati Thanda-Lake Eyre, is usually a dry salt plain, but in times of flood it covers 9,500 kilometres² (3,668 sq. miles).

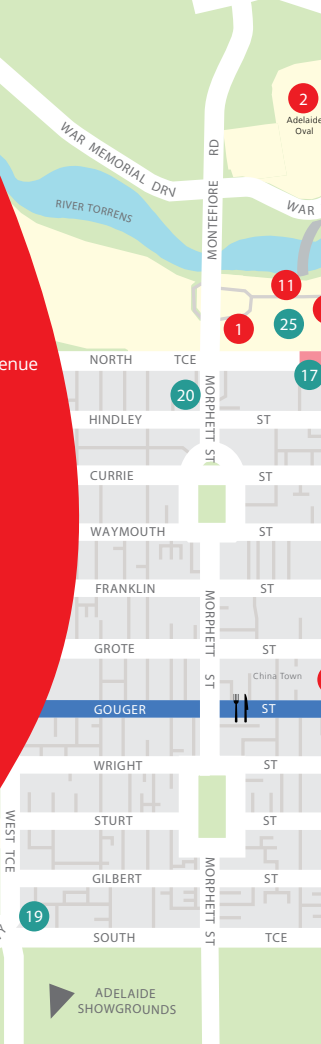

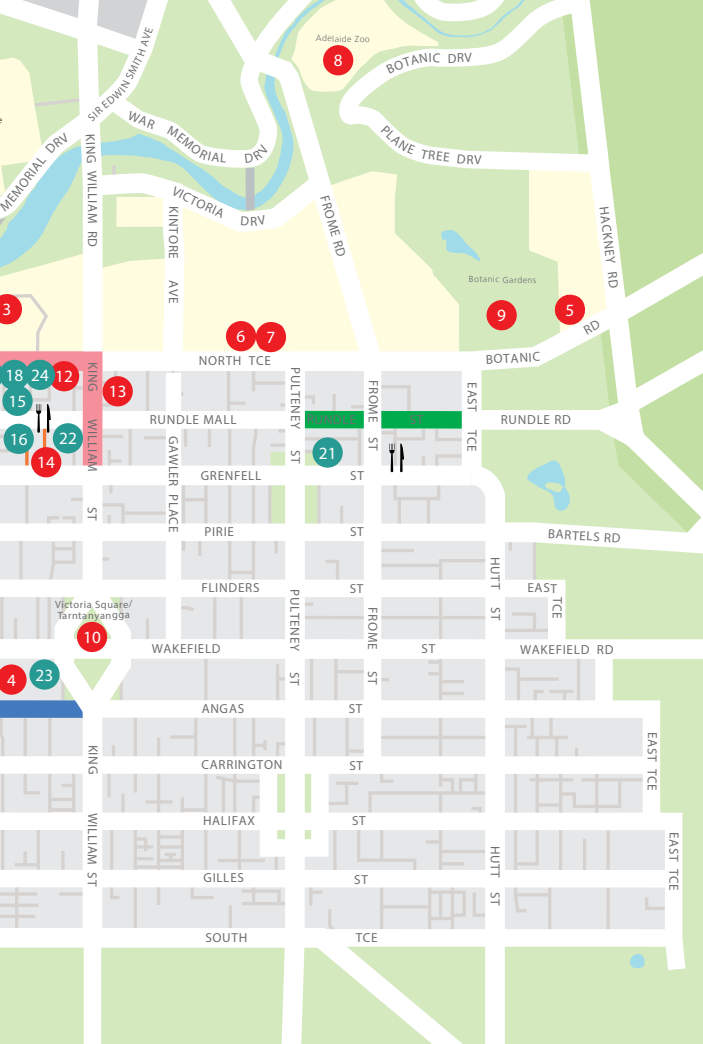

2. Adelaide Central Market

Make your way through South Australia's most prominent food hub. Take in the colourful sites, intriguing aromas and delicious delicacies from 80 specialty stalls.

3. Hahndorf

Getting Around

Public Transport

The Adelaide Metro network includes buses, trains and a tram line extending from Glenelg, through the city, and to the Adelaide Entertainment Centre.

Adelaide city centre offers a free City Loop bus service, linking the city's major cultural, entertainment, retail and educational centres. Look for the 98 and 99 buses.

A free tram service is also available between the South Terrace CBD stop and the Entertainment Centre.

Adelaide Metro cards are required for any paid travel on public transport outside of the free travel zones.

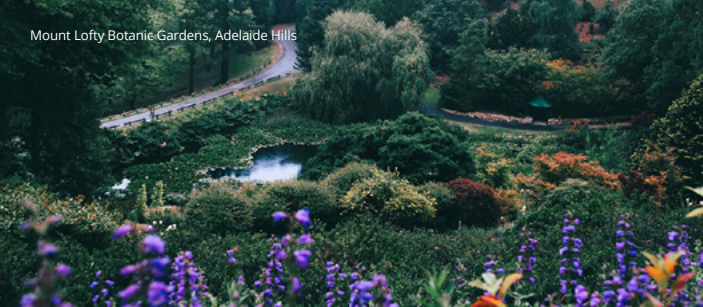

Travel Tips

Currency

The Australian dollar (\$, A\$, AUD) is used throughout Australia. Gentle haggling can be observed at weekend markets and vintage shops, but it is generally not done in Australia. There are ATMs, banks and foreign currency exchange locations all over the Adelaide CBD.

The goods and services tax (GST) is a value added tax of 10% and is already included in retail prices.

Tipping is not expected but is appreciated by service staff.

Time Zone

Adelaide, South Australia sits within the Australian Central Standard Time zone (GMT +9:30).

Adelaide City WiFi

Fast and free WiFi. Simply choose 'Adelaide Free' from the available networks list. If travelling further afield, there is a network of 60 free WiFi hotspots across the state.

Climate

South Australia has a Mediterranean climate, with warm, dry summers and mild winters. Spring is between the months September to November. At this time, the trees are a lush green and flowers bloom in the city parks. The average daily temperature is a pleasant 21.7°C. For more information, visit the Bureau of Meteorology website.

Processing over 8.5 million passengers annually, it creates nine direct international flight paths and more than 300 one-stop connections around the globe. The Tourist Refund Scheme (TRS) allows you to claim a refund of some taxes that you pay on certain goods purchased in Australia. To allow enough time to make your TRS claim, you should complete your departure immigration clearance at least 90-minutes before your scheduled departure time. To speed up the process, you may start your claim via the Department of Immigration and Border Protection TRS app.
